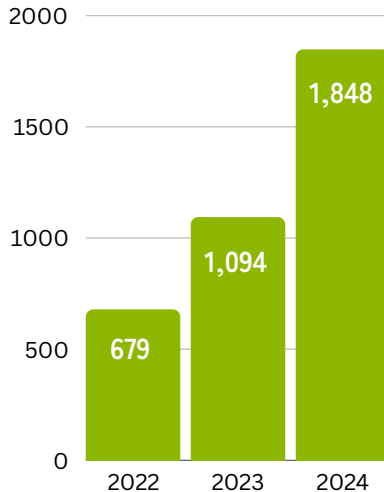

Healthy meals at the *dinner table*

In 2024, the Emergency Food Pantry transitioned to a shopping model. As families choose items from the shelves, they can select the healthy items they prefer like fresh produce & frozen meat.

Traffic in the pantry continues to rise, increasing nearly 70% last year
